Dear Brothers and Sisters,

"You are dust and to dust you shall return." This Wednesday, March 6th, we will hear these painfully honest yet strangely liberating words. With these words we begin a journey that will take us to the very brink of Easter morning. The name of this journey is Lent. We live in a society that really doesn't like to talk about mortality. We spend billions of dollars every year on a whole host of pharmaceuticals to postpone the mortality that is part of all created things. Once our loved one does die, we spend untold 1000's of dollars on postponing the inevitable decay of this created body. Yet, sooner or later, we return to the dust from which we came.

Lent is a centuries-old 40-day preparation for the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Even though the destination of Lent is resurrection, we cannot avoid the death that must take place before resurrection can occur; Lent leads us through Good Friday. In the ancient church, Easter morning was a baptism celebration; as Jesus was raised from the dead those who were baptized were raised into new life as well. The 40 days of Lent was the time of preparation for that baptism. In this day and age, we rarely have baptisms on Easter Sunday but the 40-day preparation remains. We use Lent to slow down, reflect, learn, and discipline ourselves. One could say that we use Lent to allow part of ourselves to die so that we can enter into the Easter season better prepared to live a new, "resurrected" life.

There is a part of our baptismal liturgy that asks the one being baptized (or their parents) to say 'No' to that what leads us away from God, so that we can say 'Yes' to that which leads us toward God. Therefore, it is also part of the Lenten tradition to "give up" something for the sake of strengthening our spiritual discipline. I urge you to use the time before Ash Wednesday to prayerfully reflect upon the question, "What is it that keeps me from growing in my knowledge and faith in Jesus Christ?" Another way to ask that question is, "What part of my daily routine can I give up for these 40 days that would allow me more time for quiet, prayer, and study?" Use the answer to these questions to help you decide what to "give up" for Lent.

I also invite you to say 'Yes' to something. This year our Thursday evening Lenten services will be studying one of my favorite books of the New Testament, Philippians. In this letter, the apostle Paul communicates a deep love that he has for this congregation that he founded years before. It doesn't take a biblical scholar to discover that that this congregation loves Paul back. As we study this deep and 'love'-filled book together – allow a greater knowledge of Philippians to lead you closer to a God who loves you deeply. Our Lenten services begin at 7:00 pm on Thursday, March 14 and will continue every Thursday through April 11. Join us at 6:30 for a simple soup supper provided by our youth.

Let us use Lent to say 'No' to some things in order that we may say 'Yes' to a closer relationship with God.


April 17, 6:00: Seder Meal

April 21, 10:00 Easter Brunch



#### To God you shall return

The traditional Ash Wednesday words "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return" might seem depressing. But in our often death-denying culture, some might find it refreshing to hear the frank statement that we can do nothing to save ourselves, physically or spiritually — that, no matter how we try to avoid sin, we can't untangle ourselves from self-interest. How liberating, then, to know we don't have to! God loves us as we are and sent Jesus to break sin's power over us.

A pastor described Ash Wednesday as the point you can pinch in the middle of a long piece of ribbon, such that when you lift it high, the two ends — one symbolizing our baptism and the other, our funeral — meet and touch. We come from dust and will return to dust, but we also come from God and will return to God. Ash Wednesday reminds us that we're always safe in God's love.


