Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and reverence. (1 Peter 3:15-16)

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

For most of us who grew up in Lutheran churches, we didn't hear a lot of testimonies given in worship. This was not because our Lutheran ancestors didn't have faith stories to tell (they did), but it just didn't seem to fit within the context of our liturgical tradition. I also believe that throughout the years, we pastors have communicated the message (consciously or unconsciously) that only those who have gone to seminary have a faith story to tell. That is too bad. Helping each other come to the point where we can tell our stories is something the Church should be about. How else can we become comfortable in sharing the faith that God has given us?

One of the things that I have most enjoyed about being your pastor for the last five years has been to hear the testimonies given by our fellow sisters and brothers of SOTH. More than 75 of you have stood before the congregation and – in one way or another – have shared how you have seen God in motion in your lives. Some of the testimonies have come in the form of the faith statements of 34 young people on the day of their confirmation. Another 20 or so have come in the form of our Godin-Motion stories. Yet another 21 have come during the somber Good Friday reflections on Jesus' seven last words. As I think about it, we certainly should count the experiences of our middle schoolers and high schools as they have shared how camp and high school mission trips have spoken to them as well as those adults who went to Nicaragua in 2018. In total, more than 100 people have come forward during our worship services to share how they have seen God at work in their particular context.

It is so important that we hear these stories from you. I can stand up in front of the congregation and tell stories of my life — but you kind of expect a pastor to do that. I can even tell the stories of other people that I have known (with their permission of course), but it is not the same. It is much more effective to hear these experiences from your own lips. It does not take long to realize that the struggles we have are also the struggles shared by many others — ageing, divorce, loss of spouse, illness, bankruptcy, etc. It is not only important to hear how others may be walking the same difficult path, but how we have seen God at work in the midst of the challenge. Of course, it is not only important for us to hear the stories, but it is important for you to tell the story. In telling our stories, our faith is strengthened. To those who have shared their testimonies, thank you. I am humbled by your courage. God strengthens our faith and hope through you. To those who have not yet stepped forward to share your faith stories, pray about it. We need to hear your story and how God has been at work through that story.





Above and beyond

When 20-year-old Hunter Shamatt lost his wallet while traveling to a wedding last fall, he assumed its contents — including \$60 in cash — were gone forever. But not only did someone return the wallet and everything inside it; the good Samaritan also *added* money. "I rounded your cash up to an even \$100 so you can celebrate getting your wallet back," read a note signed with the initials TB.

Hunter's mom, who posted a photo of the note on Facebook, said her faith in humanity was restored. The world's "not as grim as it's being made out to be," Jeannie Shamatt wrote.

Like the good Samaritan in Luke 10:25-37, "TB" — who turned out to be Todd Brown of Omaha — went above and beyond in expressing kindness to a stranger. May we do likewise, bandaging one another's wounds, providing comfort, sacrificing our resources and showing mercy, all in Jesus' name.
