We have also enjoyed music provided by the Praise Band and soloists David Helfert, Jan Rauworth, Tom Gustafson, and Harold Sager from time to time.

The Allegro Bell Choir, basically made up of only three families, could easily follow COVID safety guidelines and was the first group to reconvene during COVID. They willingly rehearsed during the summer months and have continued throughout the fall.

Shepherd Ringers returned in the October and Reverberations began again just before Christmas. All groups were social distancing, wearing gloves, and masks.

Through it all David Rhodes has continued to play beautiful preludes and postludes as though no virus existed.

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Deepest thanks to these people for not only giving their time and talent but also for coming forward at a very difficult and scary time to see that the work of the music ministry continues not only to enhance the word of God but also to bring joy, hope, and comfort.
